
GENÇLİĞE HİTABE







There are three articles in English. They are a/ an/ the. They are a type of adjectives and used before nouns or noun equivalents. "A/ An" are called indefinite articles and "the" is called definite article.

→ Indefinite articles are used before singular nouns and show us that the noun is general. They are not used with plurals or uncountables.

"A" is used before a singular noun beginning with a consonant sound.
